1. School Health Nursing at all 4 County Schools
 - Vision screening annually for all students in grades 1, 3, 5, 7 & 9 and special education
 - Vision screening for all students referred by a teacher
 - Hearing screening annually for all students in grades 1, 3, 5, 7 & 9 and special education
 - Hearing screenings for all students referred by a teacher
 - Preschool clinics for incoming kindergarten students which include student health record preparation, medical history development, blood pressure evaluations, vision and hearing screening, general health problem solving and referral for any required immunizations to the health district clinics.
 - Assist in maintenance of all student health records
 - Nurse evaluations of all students classified as:
 - a. Mentally handicapped
 - b. Developmentally handicapped
 - c. Learning disabled
 - d. Students having other medical problems referred by a teacher
 - e. In "Cluster"
 - One of three nurses visits each public school building in the district as per signed agreement.
2. Ohio Bureau of Children with a Medical Handicap program
 - Nurse evaluates students eligibility as indicated under program guidelines
 - Student education classes as time permits
 - School staff education classes upon request
 - Individual student (health related) problem solving
 - Student Health problem referral and follow up
 - Guidance for families needing assistance in obtaining medical care appropriate for the student's needs.
 - Immunizations and blood pressure checks for school personnel as needed
 - Assistance in control of nuisance diseases (head lice, etc)
3. Infant PKU testing as needed
4. Blood pressure monitoring
5. Blood Glucose screening
6. Public Health nursing assessment and education of persons in the home
7. Newborn baby visits
8. Investigation and control of communicable/infectious diseases
9. Sexually transmitted disease counseling and reporting
10. Follow up bereavement/support for families of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome
11. Childhood Immunization Clinics held weekly in-house and 3 satellite clinics monthly
12. Childhood Immunization record maintenance and parent notification of needed immunizations
13. Adult Immunization Clinics weekly
14. Tuberculosis testing for contacts of known or suspected cases
15. WIC nutritional education and food supplement program (federally funded)
16. Environmental Nuisance investigations and enforcement
17. Housing complaints
18. Animal bite investigations and quarantine
19. Animal head rabies testing
20. Public school building inspections at least twice yearly
21. Licensing Mary Rutan Hospital maternity program
22. Assistance in indoor air pollution, outdoor air pollution, point source and non-point source water pollution investigations and enforcement.
23. Water well testing when ordered by a physician as part of an infectious disease investigation or outbreak
24. Public water supply monitoring and follow up
25. Resident Camp inspection program
26. General Public Health Education and assistance
